Section 1: Product Identification

- **Product Name:** Methyl Anthranilate
- **Chemical Formula:** C₈H₉NO₂
- **CAS No:** 134-20-3
- **Synonyms:** MA; Methyl 2-aminobenzoate
- **Recommended Use:** Used in flavors, fragrances, and as an intermediate in organic synthesis.

Section 2: Hazards Identification

- **Classification (GHS):** Eye Irritant; Skin Irritant
- **Signal Word:** Warning
- **Hazard Statements:**
 - Causes skin irritation
 - Causes serious eye irritation
- **Precautionary Statements:**
 - Avoid contact with skin and eyes
 - Wear protective gloves, protective clothing, and eye protection

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- Wash thoroughly after handling
- IF ON SKIN: Wash with plenty of water; if irritation persists, get medical advice
- IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes

Section 3: Composition / Information on Ingredients

- **Concentration:** 98%

Section 4: First Aid Measures

- **Inhalation:** Remove person to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, seek medical attention.
- **Skin Contact:** Wash with plenty of soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing. Seek medical attention if irritation develops.
- **Eye Contact:** Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses if present. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.
- **Ingestion:** Rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. Seek medical attention if unwell.

- **Specific Hazards:** Combustible liquid. Emits carbon oxides and nitrogen oxides under fire conditions.
