Section 1: Product Identification

- **Product Name:** 2-Ethylhexanol
- **Chemical Formula:** C₈H₁₈O
- **CAS No:** 104-76-7
- **Synonyms:** 2-EH; Octan-2-ol; 2-ethylhexyl alcohol
- **Recommended Use:** Laboratory chemical, solvent, intermediate in organic synthesis, plasticizer precursor.

Section 2: Hazards Identification

- **Classification (GHS):** Acute toxicity, Oral (Category 4); Skin irritation (Category 2); Eye irritation (Category 2A); Specific target organ toxicity - single exposure (Category 3, respiratory tract irritation).

Section 4: First Aid Measures

Section 6: Accidental Release Measures

- **Personal Precautions:** Use personal protective equipment. Avoid breathing vapors. Ensure adequate ventilation. Eliminate ignition sources.
- **Environmental Precautions:** Prevent entry into drains and waterways.
- **Cleanup Methods:** Absorb with inert material (sand, earth). Collect in suitable container for disposal.

- **Handling:** Avoid inhalation of vapors and contact with skin/eyes. Use with adequate ventilation. Keep away from ignition sources.
- **Storage:** Keep container tightly closed. Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated place away from heat and oxidizing agents.

- **Appearance:** Colorless to slightly yellow liquid
- **Odor:** Mild, sweet odor

- **Solubility:** Slightly soluble in water; miscible with organic solvents

- **Stability:** Stable under normal conditions.
