### Section 1: Product Identification

- **Product Name:** Vetiverol
- **Chemical Formula:** C<sub>15</sub>H<sub>24</sub>O
- **CAS No:** 68129-81-7
- **Synonyms:** Vetiver alcohol; Khusimol
- **Recommended Use:** Fragrance ingredient in perfumery; used in cosmetics and personal care formulations.

### Section 2: Hazards Identification

- **Classification (GHS):** Not classified as hazardous under GHS; may cause mild skin or eye irritation in sensitive individuals.
- **Signal Word:** Warning
- **Hazard Statements:**

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- Not expected to be harmful if swallowed in small amounts
- May cause mild skin or eye irritation
- Combustible liquid (Flash point > 100 °C)
- Keep away from heat/sparks/open flames. No smoking
- Wear protective gloves/eye protection

## Section 4: First Aid Measures
